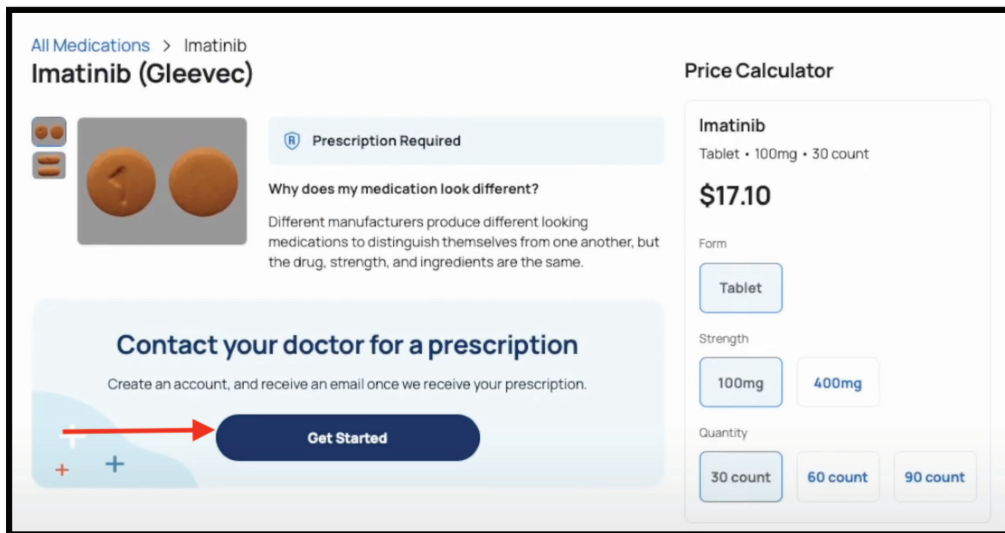
Follow these simple steps to begin saving.

3. Confirm your email

4. Complete your health profile

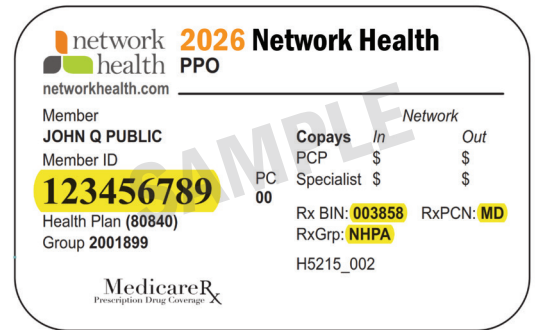
Log in and fill out your health information.

6. Request your prescription be sent to Cost Plus Drugs

Ask your doctor to send an electronic prescription to Mark Cuban Cost Plus Drug Co. (NCPDP ID# 5755167). Your provider must include the **email address** you used to sign up when sending your prescription.



Getting Your Network Health Insurance Price

- Click Request insurance price to see your Network Health price.
